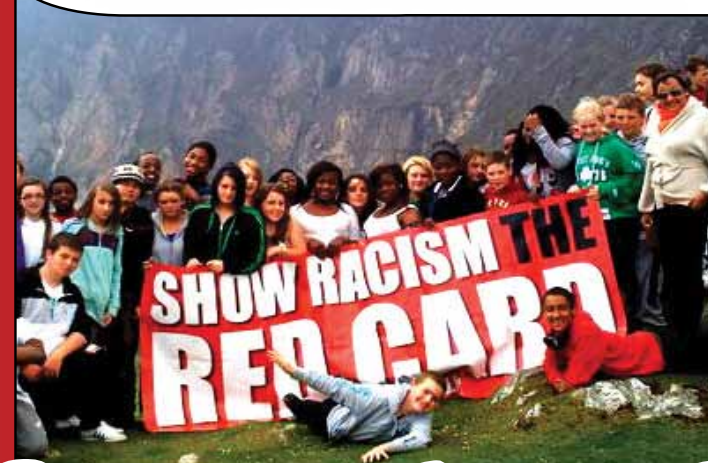

Camp Mission

- Promote integration among young people through inter-cultural learning and fun activity
- To bring young people from diverse backgrounds together in a safe and fun environment
- To acknowledge diversity whether cultural, linguistic, religious or other and to explore difference in a positive way
- To break down social barriers, which may prevent positive interaction

Camp participants

For up to 45 boys and girls aged 11-15 years from diverse cultural backgrounds living in Northern Ireland and Republic of Ireland and up to 15 volunteers

Our volunteers

The camp will be facilitated and led by a team of up to 15 volunteers from Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland and abroad and will come from a diverse range of nationalities and backgrounds. They also come from a range of professional backgrounds including teaching, childcare, coaching, youth & community work.

Accommodation & meals

The venue is an accommodation provider approved by Donegal County Council and meals provider approved by the Food Safety Authority. It is a 60 bed hostel with 18 rooms and young people will stay in rooms up to 6 per room. More information about the centre is on www.arasgcc.com Main meal suggested menus include: chicken curry & rice, lasagne & garlic potatoes, chicken & mash potatoes, beef stew and potatoes and good vegetarian options also.

Child Protection

Volunteers are Garda/Police vetted and come with references. Child Protection training for volunteers is provided by the CYC, who are approved by the HSE and the Office of the Minister for Children in child protection training.



Other policies and procedures

A number of trained first aid providers will be present at the camp at all times. Further information on our policies is available by contacting us directly.

Rules

An environment of respect for volunteers, hostel staff and for other young people is essential to the interests and safety of all. The following will not be tolerated and may result in expulsion (at parents' travel costs)

- Smoking/ alcohol/ drug consumption
- Bullying/ intimidation
- Unauthorised absence
- Unsupervised swimming
- Breaching agreed rules as set out on first day of camp

Information for parents/ guardians

A lot of thought has gone in on our part to ensuring this camp will be a memorable and rewarding experience for all. We will do our utmost to ensure the well-being of the young people. In return, we ask that the young people cooperate and participate in all aspects of the programme.

Camp Activities

A typical day starts at 8am and will finish after 10pm and the day is packed with fun and interesting activities.

Intercultural learning

Participants will be introduced to new languages, cultures and countries. Volunteers and young people will give presentations on their countries and cultures. Participants will have the opportunity to learn songs, dances, sports, stories and traditions from other countries. Last year, participants learned Russian, Russian dancing, Swahili, African dancing, Italian, French, Irish, Spanish and sign language.

Fun and games

Among the activities participants will enjoy are coasteering, badminton, table tennis and others sports. They will also do arts and crafts and participate in team building games and drama. We will visit the local folk village museum. We will also spend time on some of the most beautiful beaches in Ireland. A highlight of the camp is a visit to Slieve League, which is the highest accessible sea cliff in Europe.
